It's hard to believe that it is the end of the school year! Our 4-year olds, the majority of whom are 5 now, are about to enter kindergarten. Parents may wonder, is my child ready for the "big" school? You may be surprised at what skills kindergarten teachers expect their new students to have.

You might think that it is most important that they know their ABCs and numbers when they enter kindergarten. While teachers would like children to come in with some letter and number recognition, they don't want children to be drilled on academic skills. Instead, they are interested on the equally important readiness skills that will set the stage for your child's life long learning. Raising an excited learner is the goal. This can be achieved through day to day activities. Some of the most important readiness skills for kindergarten are: enthusiasm for learning; solid oral language skills; the ability to listen; the desire to be independent and the ability to play well with others.

The most important thing to do for your child is to focus on fun, not to push them to a particular skill if they are not ready. Relax and enjoy your children. They grow up fast! Read, play and go places. Have a wonderful summer! We will miss our almost kindergartners. We enjoyed watching them grow throughout the school year.

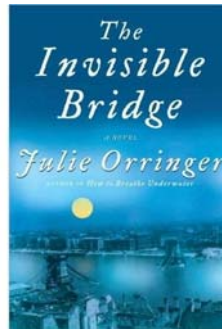

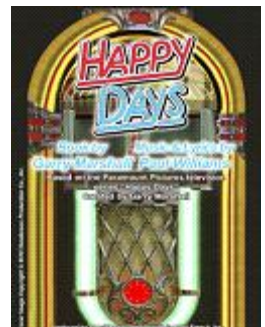
May 20th – Men's Club Award Dinner and Service

Jonathan Altman was a dynamic leader of Temple Isaiah. At the time of his tragic death, he was actively involved through the Temple in the resettlement of a Vietnamese family. This fund was established to continue his work in causes involving social action.

Judaica/Torah Fund

Used for maintenance and repair of the Torah and religious objects used during ceremonies.

Life Cycle Fund

Used to support the activities associated with the various life cycle events of our congregation. Often chosen in honor of a B'nai Mitzvah, a Confirmation, a baby naming or a wedding.

Michael Brunner Prayerbook Fund

Michael Brunner was the third president of Temple Isaiah. After he died of cancer, this fund was established to replace or repair *Gates of Heaven* prayerbooks.

Mortgage Reduction Fund

To aid in reducing the Temple's Mortgage

Preschool Fund

To help support special programming, equipment and materials for teacher's professional development and for scholarships to help families in need.

President's Discretionary Fund

Overseen by the Temple president and used at his/her discretion on behalf of the Temple.

Rabbi's Discretionary Fund

Overseen by the Rabbi and used at his discretion on behalf of the Temple.

Religious School Fund

To provide materials for the extracurricular activities of the TI Religious School.

Sternberger Youth Leadership Fund

As a rabbinic advisor, Rabbi Richard Sternberger helped establish Temple Isaiah. To mark his years of service in the UAHC, TI established this fund to encourage children to attend a UAHC camp or institute who might not ordinarily be able to do so without assistance.

Youth Scholarship/Youth Group Fund

Proceeds used to provide support for programs involving Jewish activities and studies such as camp, conferences and trips to Israel for the youth of Temple Isaiah. Proceeds are also used to support Youth Group activities.
